A company of military have been stationed at this Agency.
 8th 4th day Clear & Warm. Another conflicting report respecting the trains reported as destroyed by the Indians. It is now reported that four wagons were all that were in the train, destroyed, but still no reliable information from there. A military escort has been sent to the Cheyenne Agency to escort the women & children of that Agency to this place. Agent Richards is confined to his bed but is better than for a couple of days back.

9th 5th day Cloudy but warm. Wrote home No 41. No particular news.

10th, 11th 6th & 7th days Clear & very Warm. Not able to get away from this Agency. Visited the shops & mill &c. The Agent getting better, but of I, 8th day threatened with Paralysis, — the effect of the shock his nerves received from the stroke of lightning, received a few days before my arrival at this Agency.

12th 1st day Clear & Warm. Attended Meetings after which, went with A. Worth & Wife to attend a meeting of their appointing at Guadalupe village, which was well attended, & I trust was profitable. I was unexpectedly, much enlarged in communicating some of the simple truths of the gospel to this poor people, & hope they may be received as truth, they were very attentive, & though they claimed that some things that was told were new to them, they corresponded with a sense they had in their own hearts & believed them to be true. They appear to be anxious that religious meetings should be continued among them every first day.
