

7th Mo 18⁷⁶

23rd 5th day Clear, & very Warm Travelled slowly, about twenty miles, mostly through timber, with some high rolling prairie, of better quality, & more free from rocks, than most we have passed, this side of the Washita river, camped by a small stream of water about 10 miles from Caddo, Water being from springs is cooler than any we have found on the road, except at the store in S. Pauls Valley.

24th 6th day Clear, Warm & Dry After a tedious ~~road~~ ride, over hills & rocks, through valleys, dense woods & clouds of dust arrived at Caddo, took dinner, & about 2, o'clock got started on the cars for home by way of M, K, & T, R & Hannibal.

25th 7th day Clear, Hot & Dusty Passed through the North Eastern part of Indian Ter. & South Eastern Kansas in the night, & entered Missouri early in the morning, arrived at Hannibal about four, o'clock, took passage for Quincy immediately after, where I arrived a little before Sundown

26th 1st day Clear, but cooler, Took passage on board the Lake Superior for Burlington, but did not get under way until noon on account of having damaged
