The following is reported for the information of Division commander - Ft Dodge Kans Sept 18  
eighteen twenty eight - The following just received from Camp Supply Ft H. Lewis Kent Col nineteenth Infantry September sixteenth. Dowall Courier & Scout for Rendlebrock has just arrived here nine o'clock and reports that the troops came up with the Indians on Friday the thirteenth and attacked them the Indians about one hundred & thirty strong all well armed were strongly posted on a range of hills soon surrounded the cavalry killing three and wounding three men and killing & wounding a number of horses several officers have been sent out from this post with an ambulance to meet Rendlebrock and bring in the wounded they will reach here this evening. The Indians sent their women and children ahead and remained to give battle. They will cross the Arkansas west of Dodge. Kempfhill with his company supposed to be at Dodge Rendlebrock and command moving toward this post. The direction taken by the Indians is learned from the scout. There should be more cavalry at this post.
