Counting coup on an enemy ^{four times} was simply a method by which the warriors showed ^{in a contest with} the victors over their enemies.

About 1896. Senator Hansbrough of North Dakota introduced a bill relative to pensioning these Indian Police but ~~it~~ failed through some reason unknown.

Ex. Commissioner of Indian Affairs. C. H. Burke, when in Congress, was repeatedly asked to do something for these police but he never did anything toward it. ^{nearly 40 years afterward - after McLoughlin had passed away} Senator Lynn De Haven of North Dakota succeeded getting pensions for the widows and survivors - very few left.
