I've intended to drop you a line ever since meeting you and your daughter in Oklahoma City. We certainly were glad of that opportunity and hope we may get together again when neither of us is so rushed.

We finished our tour a couple of weeks ago, then went to Frisco to see the fair for a few days. We thought it worth while, beautifully arranged. The Indian Arts and Crafts exhibit was particularly fine and I think the Arts and Crafts Board will really accomplish things if given half a chance.

At Fort Hall, Idaho, recently we saw a large tipi which was being prepared for a Peyote ceremony. This tipi would have interested you, I believe. I understand that in past times some of these mountain Indians were noted for their poor lodges, but whenever they learned to make them they evidently borrowed principles from neighboring peoples. This tipi was erected on a four pole frame, but the remainder of the poles were spiraled in like the Sioux and Cheyenne. The smoke flaps had pockets.

We plan to go back to Crow Agency for a visit with the doctor there and hope to beat Standing Rock for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebrations.
