Way up North where the Missouri River forks, the Sioux

was about to be killed by the Sioux when Sitting Bull arrived.
The boy cried and called S.B. ^{gassawessah} "older brother" and hung on to him.
S.B. not having a younger brother, took pity on him and
through the influence of S.B. friends saved him. S.B. raised
the boy ^{who} ~~and~~ was loyal to him unto death.
