He wound up his speech by saying that a council was to be called for the purposing of considering the proposition of opening up mines in the Little Rockies Country and that Four Horn, a Sioux was chosen, to be one of the council men. Both Crow Foot and Pretty Eagle told S. B. that this was something S. B. should look after.

We went back to Canada and got along fine with the Queens soldiers. Three years after the Custer Fight while we were out on our own grounds hunting, Gen. Miles again fought us, killing men, women and children so we again went back to Canada, where there were buffaloes and other game to afford us to live well.

Five years after the Custer Fight while in Canada the Indians had a council about returning to our own grounds. (U. S.) Crow King, Foolish Heart, He Dog, Big Road No Neck, Running Horse, Fool Bull, Turning Bear, Spotted Eagle and Gall were in favor of returning to the States, which was approved and permitted by S. B. S. B. told them he also was going to come back to the States soon thereafter. but that, just at that time the Queen's soldiers had invited him which he had accepted hence could not join them. So part of the S. B. followers left. Soon after word was received that the S. B. Indians were badly treated at Fort Peck Agency, Mont. and that they were held as captives at Fort Buford. S. B. heard this and at once sent me with two others, Bone Club and young Four Horns. A Queens officer went along with us. The Indian had been shot at, disarmed - ponies and weapons of war were confiscated. Rations and even beads were issued them. This we saw and
