The Sioux Indians called it Heraka-wakpa, which means Elk Horn river. Arrow Creek is O'Fallon creek. The Sioux Indians called it Wahinkpe-wakpa. The Mizpah is known to the Indians as "Where the Old Indian woman broke her leg" Trusting this will suffice and with best wishes and hoping to see you again this summer.
