I was informed yesterday by Henry Agard a French mixed blood that has always been here, who took part in the burning of Ft Fetterman, was in the battle of Fort Phil Kearney and knows the Indian history pretty well altho he can not speak English. S. B. made a trip to Fort Yates in the fall of 1890 when he brought Mrs Weldon to Ft Yates.

Every one around the agency knew that Sitting Bull had come in intending to go right back without staying over night. Red Tomohawk, Shave Head and Bullhead way laid him. They were armed with guns to shoot him and bring him in. They were under a bridge one mile south of Yates. Sitting Bull drove a gray team and could easily be distinguished. The Creek is called Long Soldier Creek. The night was windy. The military police could not hear very good. S. B. took a different route about two miles west there is another crossing
