I have received your letter with regard to Sitting Bull. We do not have any unpublished material concerning him. Volume II, South Dakota Historical Collections contains a History of the Dakotah or Sioux Indians by Doane Robinson, and of course Sitting Bull is given considerable mention in it since this was his home. It is now thirty-eight years since Sitting Bull was killed at his home on Grand River by the Indian police. Very few people remain who were acquainted with him. There is a tendency to confuse the actual part played by Sitting Bull. As you know he was not a warrior but a medicine man. It becomes increasingly difficult to separate fiction from fact regarding him.

Volume II above mentioned is out of print but you can no doubt secure it from the State Historical Society at Oklahoma City.
