My dear Professor Campbell;-

I am sending you today the Grouard book and the typed copy of the tweaty of 1851 from the Missouri epublican. I am glad to be of service to you. This news paper account I "had dug out" of the files by a special reserach worked for me at St Louis.

When finished with both pleace return to me. Do not file them away until you return as I frequently need the material in my classes. The proto was taken a year ago on the site of the treaty gathering. Most every thing is as it was in 1851, the same water gourse, Horse Cr and the North Platte, the overflowing banks, the long stretch of meadow on which the 60,000 Indian ponies grazed the same whistling wind (something of a breeze that day), the sunshine. The place on the program for history of event was given to me where I spoke in the open. Evens as this are not easily for gotten. I am standing in frony of the bronze plaque, head against it.
