In this letter I am sending you photographs of some old drawings of Sitting Bull's warlike deeds. These are copies in black and whits. The real ones are colored. They are copies of a set of drawings which Sitting Bull gave to his "brother" Hohe before 1870. Probably Hohe (Little Assimboine) made them.

On the backs of the drawings are the stories as the white man understood them when Sitting Bull explained them. But some of them he would not say much about. Because he was a prisoner of war, and was afraid to talk of his battles mixims with the soldiers, perhaps. You will find that handwarklex after number 14 there is a jump to number 23. This is because all the ones between are just like number 14.

There is another jump grom number 38 to number 52. This jump was filled with drawings of Hohe's own doeds.

I wish you would try to find out all about the true stories of these fights. I think there are mistakes in the white man's atories of these fights. You can write out the true story on paper and number it the same as the drawing, or write on the back of the drawing.

I hope you will try to enswer all my questions. All I ask is the truth.

I am sending you some money in this letter. I will let you know later about the extra money you ask for. I have to ask my publisher about that.
