from many military posts was sent out to
capture him. Sitting Bull & He was captured &
After some skirmish & with the soldiers & and
was killed & and for a sort of a bluff
his own nephew & also a sort of a chief
was ordered & by the military officers
to kill his uncle Sitting Bull & or be killed
himself & His nephew killed him &
Sitting Bull was one of the worst white mans
enemies & I know of & I have about 20 of the
old chief Indian warrioes & pictures & Sitting Bull
included & well Mr. Campbell & as I am not
sure if you can read this letter & on account of
poor spelling & writing & I think I better stop
If this much is of any benefit to you &
well and good & if there is any thing I can
through a sight on & a part the wild and woolly
west & I will be glad to do so - mean time
