Referring to your letters of June 29th and July 10th relative to maps of certain battles of Indian operations in the northwest, you are advised that the following maps can be furnished at the prices indicated:

- ① "Map of the Route of the Big Horn Expedition", Commanded by Brig. General G. Crook, March 1st to 26th, 1876 Photostat \$0.70
- ② "Map of Col. Baker's Camp on the Yellowstone River".
Attacked by the Indians on the 14th of August, 1872 . . . \$0.35 ✓
- ③ "Map of the Battle of Powder River between Companies "E" "I" & "K" 2nd "E" "F" & "M" 3rd Cavalry under command of Col. J. J. Reynolds, 3rd Cavalry, and the hostile Band of Ogallala Sioux under Crazy Horse, March 17th, 1876.

- ④ "Sketch of Crazy Horse's Village and Vicinity". Drawn by Chas. Morton, 2nd Lieut., 3rd Cav. \$0.35 ✓

Maps of the remaining battles indicated in your letter have not been located in this office. There is on file in this office:

- (a) "Map of the Route of the North Western Indian Expedition", commanded by Brig. Gen. A. Sully, surveyed and drawn in the summer, 1864, by H. von Minden, Captain. Photostat of this map will cost \$1.40

This office has no photographs of the battles in which you are interested. There is on file a set of stereoptican views of the Black Hills, containing fifty-one views, some of which show movements of troops under General Custer. These photographs could be loaned to you for review and to have copies made locally, if you desire.
