when abt 50 mi fr Buford, wagoons hove in sight. SB struck his chest ,& grunted "Americand are coming" SB, mtd, turned back. But soon saw it was half breeds grew quiet.

july 21 surrender. Inspector McDonnel of Canadaina NW Mtd there. SB handed his gun to his little boy, lad of 8 yrs. "My boy, if you live you can never be a man in this wirld because you never can have a gun or pony." boy handed gun to Maj Brotherton. SB said to B. "The land I have under my feet is mine again, I never sold it, never gve it to anybody. If I left Black Hills 5 yrs ago it was because I wd raise my family quietly. It is the law of the Queen to have everything quiet in that place, but I that all the time to come back to this country, and now as Legare was bringing my friends here II heard one of my girls was with him) I determined to start from 10QAppelle and come with him to Ft Buford, and now I want to make a bargain with the USGovt, a solid one. I want to have withesses on both side, some Englishmen, some Americans.B" (downlike)

the bargain was made, the surrnder complete, JLouis L sratted back to Willow Bunch.

July 15, 87 Legare entered suit for \$13,412.00 in US court of claims. Many years later he got some thing. the evidence taken in Regina, fall '88 is basis of this story, by F C WADE counsel for dept of justice of US under the Commission. many officers of Mtd, Father Germain, etc. were witnesses.
