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MILES PURSUIE OF THE SIOUX. - The pursuit of the Soo after the Little Big Horn affairwas weak in the extreme. In October, 1876¢ this military inactivity was brought to a close by the exit of 1,000 ledgges from the Standing RockAgency, and the non-appearance when it should arrive. Scouts failed to kearn of this train, and on Oct. 1u, 1876, General Miles ordered outthest 5th U S Inf. On the 18th the troops met the supply train. Col Otta stated that after the forst day'smarch the hed was attacked about 3a.m. by SB's band, and a couple dozen mukes stampeded. The following day it was 88 harrassedso much on itsmarch that it was obliged to put back. It was again started out and was attacked again, this time during the day; about 300 or 350 Ind taking part in the fight which followed. Failing instampeding the mules or capturing the train, they sent in a flag of truce, and repented of this xxx this attack, promising not to molest the trains any more, stipulating however, that the train guard should not in the future kill any more buffalo. Then they left, and the train moved off without any more trouble. After receving this information Gen Miles decided to order the 22nd Regiment to Tangue River and proceed with thr 5th Regiment to punish the Soor On the 19th of October this plans was putin practice. The 5th Kegiment proceeded fifteen miles to Cherry Creek, where camp was made. On the 20th the command reached Cedar Creek, where the train guard had seen the suvages last, and where also, they did not delay showing themselves to the 5th Regiment. A few councils between SB and Gen Miles were held on Oct. 2p0 and 21st, 1876, but the chief resolved to fight rather than the agree to the terms of peace proposed by Miles. A battle ensued in which the Ind were repulsed with heavy loss inmen and supplies. Later the Minneconjous and Sans Arcs surrendered, giving as hostages their chiefs, Black Eaglem, Ked Shirt, Sunrise, Sitting Eagle, White Bull and Foolish Bull.

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
