In the terible convolsion of the earth, all Indians who are not prepared to welcome tieir Lord will meet with the same Iaje as he whibes. Therefore, omy people, I exhort, may, comand you to do all that the good man says, in order that you may not sumer he death a our despised enemies.
whe holv peacher frather say that the overpowerng of those who have opressed us is not to be accomplished by force or arms, that no weapons te to le used. We are simply to pray and trost in he Messiah, and dance as he shall command. This is to us a very strange docterthe, af yon will admit. We have been accustomed to inght, not to pras. Terefore we must be /2.550/ all the more carefly to obey every command of the new Saviour, or we will displease him.
"In concinsion, I have but to urge upon you bo watch very carecully every notion of the dance which ve are aboth to execute for you, and, when you have leamed the songs and the moverems, join in with us. De repentant for your sins, pay the Great wainantenka to look down upon jou in pisy, to aive you pood and clothing. Be sincere, be earnest, and He will hear orr prayers."
