

That museum is, however, not yet open, as they are still arranging the exhibits in the new building and collecting more in the South Sea islands, on which they specialize.

So far as I know there are two robes of Mato Topa in Europe. The one illustrated in the Primer von Eried's work is in the Linden-museum in Stuttgart, and the other one (of which I enclose a duplicate photo) is in Bern, Switzerland. The latter was probably brought to Switzerland by Karl Bodmer, the artist who accompanied the prince on his famous voyage to the upper Missouri.

On the latter robe you see in the lower right hand corner an illustration of M.T.'s fight with the Chyame chief, in the course of which the latter cut M.T.'s hand with his knife. The group to the left shows probably an earlier stage of the same fight. In another group the mighty chief seems to kill two women and in the upper right hand corner he charges a large body of enemies who are on horseback (= $\frac{3}{3}$) and on foot ($\frac{3}{3}$).
