Dear Campbell:

The photos \mathcal{A}^{efe} sent you etc. have safely arrived and I shall be glad to help you out with any other material which I have and which you may want to see.

Thank you for the reference regarding the brother- friend ceremony of the existence of which I knew nothing.

Of any jealousies existing between different bands of the Tetoms I also know nothing although I have a faint recollection that a man from the Rosebud reservation expressed some displeasure with the people of Pine Ridge but I did not pay any attention to the matter sufficiently to know what it was about or whether it was more than a merely personal feeling.

I noticed **non**ever a marked dislike of the Ogalala, or at least of some of them, for the <u>Cheyennes</u> (northern) of whom some lived in 1909 on the Pine Ridge reservation. Theyreferred to the Cheyennes emphatically as "sica" (pron. "sheechah"), i. e. "bad". Just what had caused this feeling I could not find out. In the wars of the sixties the two tribes were allied (under Red Cloud") and they have intermarried considerably although speaking radically different languages (Siouan and Algonquin). I once saw a Cheyenne at Pine Ridge and he seemed to feel very uncomfortable in that neighborhood. He used the sign language only.
