Donaldson, late of the Department Of English, Montana State College, and I, last summer obtained from the Kutenai Indians, of Montana, and British Columbia, 35,000 words of their exceedingly interesting and important myths and legends. Next summer we want to be with them again and get in full the social organization, history, and religion of the tribe, so to make a Kutenai book of real value. But owing to unforseen and most unfortunate wiping out of our funds, the we will not have the means to do this And we would require so little. \$I200. Do you think that the Guggenheim Foundation may possibly help us? Anyhow, will you please let me know its address.
