As it happened, Miss Lowry came into my office just ten minutes after I got your letter. She is not teaching here, I think. I gave her your address.

I wish to thank you for your kindness in sending me the address of Miss Satterlee, and the other information. You speak of the papers of Joseph R. Brown: what are these? Are they extensive? If there are passages pertaining to Sitting Bull and to his relations with the Minnesota Indians after 1862, I should be happy to see them. Have you a transcript which could be loaned to me? Or could you have one made? What would be the cost to me? It is not primarily the Minnesota Massacre I want to study, but its relation to the Western Sioux, and to Sitting Bull. Please advise me.
