Council held June 2nd 1877, at the Teton or Sitting Bull's Camo.

Present:-Lieut-Col. Irvine, Inspector Walsh, Sub-Inspector Clark and Sub-Inspector Allen.

Sitting Bull had around him Pretty Bear, Bear's Cap, The Eagle Sitting down. Spotted Eagle, Sweet Bird, Miracongae, &c., &c.; and in the Council Lodge the re must have been some hundred men, women and childred.

Inspector Walsh informed Sitting Bull and the Chiefs that Lieut-Col. Irvine w was the highest chief of the Great Mother at present innthe country, and that he had n now come to their camp to hear wha they had to day to him, and to learn for what purpose the three Americans who at present were in the camp had come from American to Canadian territory to their camp.

Sitting Bull: - Those Americans are not going to stay. Insp. Walsh: -The Chief will speak about that afterwards.

Pretty Bear, who is a chief, not a soldier now, opened the council with the fo fidal ting prepar following prayer: -God Almighty look down on me. Look on me my grabdfa father (mean ing grandfather (s spirit) - (here all the chiefs and soldiers held their hands aloft. My grabdfather look onme; see the course I am going to raise afterthis kar (with (hands up again). Look on me, Iam noghing now; have pity on me (hands up and grunts) My grandfather, you raised me to eat buffalo meatm to be strong; I am nothing now. (Here, Pretty Bear, points to the great peace pipe, which he holds aloft all through thr prayer). To the south, thounder, war, is my relation; west, they want me to be friends; north they want me to be friends; east-(Interpreter could not catch what he said with re reference to the east). My Mother, makenthis fand to be full ref take the pipe. Understand, my Mother, we are going to be raised in this ground; take hold of this pipe strong. My Mother wants me to smoke; we will all smoke. My Mother, make this hand to he full of plenty, and the land good (Peace). We are going to make, and raise, and finish. I hope that they will never fail. I am going to light the pipe straight (with truth). I have that they wild from

The pipe is here lighted with buffalo chip a match being refused, the match being considered to be deception. Sitting Bull taking the pipe pointed it to the four quarters, and handed it to the Great Chief, holding the end himself and saying: "My grandather have pity on me; we are going to be raided with a new people. All the officers smoked and also the others of the party. This is their strongest oath.

SB-I don't know anything that I can suay any other way; and my God Almighty we are going to raise another people, and that is what I amd going to speak about. We are going to raise in the North with the British. God Almighty has raised us. and God Almighty says that we are going to raise with the British without throwing away anything (Honestly). I came here to hunt nothing bad. My grandfather said we must shake hands with beadritime, standauthesenade die Anything that is but I done here to ret my Mather the British; to-day I see it all. Anything that is bad I came here to let my Mother know it. I have been looking all the time south-something bad happened there. God Almighty raised me there. Thong . All therivers ran demn to our Mother to and He nees it. My grantfather mild be weat would raised me with a big body and heart; my heart was good. The Americans always run behind me, that is the request I came this way. Ged Almighty our in ther said the Long Knives weald raise me into and then fight me; Ged Almighty stopped him, so the Americans have buffale trade. Our grand in ther so id what the ground produced raised me and you. The Americ no gave us flow in every direction; I said bold on we w
