

TAKING PART IN TODAY'S SERVICE

Today's service is being conducted by The Rev. Dr. W. A. Petzoldt of Lodge Grass, Montana. Dr. Petzoldt has spent some 50 years working among the Crow Indians of Montana, and at one time was Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Sheridan. In appreciation of many years of service to the Crows, he was given the name of "White Man Runs Him."

Today's choir is from St. Peter's Episcopal Church, under the leadership of Mr. Ralph Blackledge.

The organist for the service is Mr. R. K. Bailey of Great Falls, Montana, sales representative for the Hammond Organ Company. The Hammond organ is furnished through the courtesy of the Davis Music Company of Sheridan.

The ushers are from Explorer Post No. 112 sponsored by the Episcopal Church. The adviser for this Post is Mr. Harry Williams.

Our speaker, The Rev. Vine V. Deloria, D. D., was born in South Dakota, graduated from Kearney Military Academy in Nebraska, Bard College and General Theological Seminary. He spent some 20 years working with his people in South Dakota. In 1954 he was appointed Assistant Secretary of the Division of Domestic Missions for the Episcopal Church, in charge of the Indian Missions. In the same year, he received the Indian Achievement Award given annually by the Indian Council Fire, a national organization dedicated to the interests of the American Indian and to the preservation of Indian traditions. Dr. Deloria is the third clergyman to receive the award and the fifth Sioux. He was awarded his honorary Doctor of Divinity degree by Bard College last year.

You are welcome to visit the Indian village located in the arena immediately following this service. There is also an interesting display of arts and crafts in the Exhibit Hall which is open for your inspection.
