A little more than a hundred years ago some Delaware Indians in the service of the fur companies in the Rocky Mountains were mentioned in old records. Among these was a man whose name is given as Gray. One writer suggests that these Indians of the Rockaway sub-tribe of Delawares belong to some other tribe.

I think the record is clear, but would like to inquire whether the family name Gray was found among the Delawares when you knew them.

Also, were there any Delawares whom you knew to have been descendants from the Rockaway sub-tribe or band.

I shall be grateful for any information you can give me on these matters.
