Dear Mr. Woodard:

Thanks so much for your very helpful letter of January 19. I shall follow up your suggestions.

With regard to the Indian spelling for Rockaway, the full translation offered by the Bureau of American Ethnology is "sandy land". Some of them appear to have gone to Ontario with other Delawares and may have gone farther west as the Delawares were favored as employees of the fur companies on both sides of the line.

The next time I write Paul Eldridge I will relay your message to him.

If you get any further information about Gray, I will be grateful. This Gray was apparently a mix-blood working for the Hudson's Bay Company in 1833 near Salt Lake.
