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P. S. You will find in Paul Wellman's DEATH ON HORSEBACK now reprinted as THE INDIAN WARS OF THE WEST published by Doubleday and Company some pictures of Apache camps and warriors. The men wore a headband, white cotton breechclouts, long buckskin moccasins which reached to the knee when folded over. Sometimes the rawhide sole of the moccasin was brought up vertically in front of the toe making a circle about as a dollar. Sometimes a round silver concha was put on the front of this projection as a protection against cactus.

The most readable book which touches on the Apaches is ON THE BORDER WITH CROOK by John J. Bourke recently reprinted by Longs College Book Company, Columbus, Ohio, originally by Charles Scribner's Sons. Not all of this book is about Apaches however. I never saw photographs of the chiefs Wellman mentions. Bourke also wrote a book about Apache medicine men.

Apache women wore buckskin dresses and let their hair hang loose like the men. Their clothes were not as pretty as those of the Plains Indians.

In FIGHTING INDIANS OF THE WEST, a picture book by C. S. Schmitt and D. Brown, Scribner's Sons 1949, you will find some pictures of Apaches.
