

but in 1875 the agency was discontinued and the Indians, much to their discontent, were transferred to San Carlos, where their enemies, the Yavapai, had also been removed. (For further information regarding the dealings of the Chiricahua with the Government, see Apache.)

The members of Geronimo's band, which was captured in 1886 and sent by the War Department in turn to Florida, Alabama and Oklahoma, are now at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, where they number 298. The remaining Chiricahua were included among the Apache under Fort Apache and San Carlos agencies, Arizona. The Pinaleño are that part of the Chiricahua formerly residing in the Pinal Mountains.
