We have finally succeeded in finding a Shoshone Indian who has been able to furnish the desired information and the reward was given to him. Following is the information you desire:

1. Mountain sheep or bighorn - Mōō-zum-bi-ah
2. Young of the mountain sheep, or mountain lamb - Mōō-zum-bi-ah
Doo-watsy
3. Buffalo robe - Gwoo-tch Son-ah
4. Cloth - Wan-up
5. Umentuchen - Bad in one. A fault.
6. Tukutsey - Black horse (Pet).
7. Undewatsy - Your son.
