- (1) ha ko any me ca, hanch?
- (2) Ka hum pa, hanch?
- (3) cant tickup ko hanch.

According to Mrs. Victor, author of The River of the West, all three are in the Shoshone language. The first two were used by an old trapper in speaking to a conductor on a train. The trapper had no ticket and pretended not to understand English. The third is translated as "good meat, my friend" in the book. Is this correct!
