of local self-government and economic enterprise, to the end 1 that civil liberty, political responsibility, and economic 2 3 independence shall be achieved among the Indian peoples of the United States, and to provide for cooperation between 4 5 the Federal Government, the States, and organized Indian 6 communities for Indian welfare. It is further declared to 7 be the policy of Congress that those functions of govern-8 ment now exercised over Indian reservations by the Federal Government through the Department of the Interior and 9 10 the Office of Indian Affairs shall be gradually relinquished 11 and transferred to the Indians of such reservations, duly organized for municipal and other purposes, as the ability 12 13 of such Indians to administer the institutions and functions of representative government shall be demonstrated, and 14 15 that those powers of control over Indian funds and assets 16 now vested in officials of the Federal Government shall be terminated or transferred to the duly constituted govern-17 ments of local Indians communities as the capacity of the 18 Indians concerned, to manage their own economic affairs 19 prudently and effectively, shall be demonstrated. 20 further declared to be the policy of Congress to assist in 21 the development of Indian capacities for self-government 22 and economic competence by providing for the necessary 23training of Indians, and by rendering financial assistance and 24cooperation in establishing Indian communities. 25
