In November last Lt. + his band were in Mex., making occasional incursions into the desert, committing murders & other crimes, & undoubtedly communicating with & receiving aid & encouragement from the remainder of this people, the Chiricahua & Warm Springs Apaches, who had not left the reservations of San Carlos, the removal of these Apaches to some secure place, far away from Ariz., had been the subject at that time of frequent conference between this office & the Secy of the Interior. Not a mere temporary removal was contemplated, but a permanent withdrawal of these warlike & dangerous bands from a Territory to the prosperity & security of which they had been a constant menace from the time of the Camp Grant massacre in 1871. The Secy of Int. recommends such removal in his report to
