- Feb 3rd Bt. Capt. James Inniss, arrived from Fort Seward
 " 4th Bt. Lieut. Lartmel Rodney Smith Paymaster u.s. army, with Escort under command
 of Lieut. Philip Brade 3rd Inf. returned from Camp Supply, Indian Territory
 Bt. Major Asbury & Lieutenant W. H. French, returned from U.S. at Fort Hayes.
 Two Soldiers (Polared) 38th Infantry, admitted to Hospital with Frostbites, had been
 Out in a fearful snow-storm were enroute to join their Regiment in New Mexico
 Three (3) men 38th Inf., admitted frost-bitten feet. Had been in Snow Storm
