General Orders.

No. 11.

Under authority from the War Department, the following modification of General Orders No. 28, from these headquarters, of September 26th 1870, is hereby made: Troops pursuing Indians, who may have committed depredations among the settlements, are authorized to follow them on to their reservations and there arrest such Indians, in co-operation with the Indian Agents. Such arrests must, however, be made as required in the provisions of the above mentioned order.
