Sir:

I have the honor to report the following concerning the movements of Indians--since last report.

No Kiowas have visited the Post since ~~Sabanta~~ left here about four weeks ago. they are said to be about 100 miles south of this Post.

The war party of Arrapahoes against the Kiows are still out. Little Ravens band considering principally of old men, women and children are encamped on the South bank of the Arkansas, about 7 miles west of this Post number about 150 "Big Mouths" band of Arrapahoes, about 200, arrived here yesterday to receive supplies of flour, sugar, and coffee, from their agent. To day 150 Cheyennes "came in for the same purpose,

The Indian supply train of Maj ^{Myrcook} Myrcook, Indian Agent returning to Fort Larned, lost 29 mules and a horse, believed to have been run off by one of the war parties of Arrapahoes. The train of the wood contractor in route to this Post from Fort Larned, met a war party of Arrapahoes about 25 miles east of this Post, who demanded their provisions and threatened to fight them, if they did not give them up, being unarmed they gave up all the provisions they had. The Indians ran off six of their mules, which were eventually recovered at Fort Larned.
