Rev. F. L. Schaub, age 55, of Muskogee Okla. was killed by a bolt of lightning Sept 1, 1924 - at about 6:30 p.m. at Mules, Mo. while on a visit there -

He was a minister of the Presbyterian Church, retired - and at one time Supt. of the mission at Marble City, Okla - a good man & a leader for moral life course - a fluent speaker of the Cherokee Language -

Resident of Muskogee Okla. & was to have attended services at Vian, Okla. next Sunday, 9-7-1924 where awaited him for entrance into the Pres Church quite a number of Vian's people - such is life, hence the inevitable Death. Phoenix & World, 7-9-2-24
