ANOTHER OLD-TIMER DEAD IN SAN ANTONIO

David H. Ingram was Graduate of
Cherokee Seminary in Class With
S. L. Miller of Tulsa.

GIDEON, June 21.—Old settlers
here recall that David M. Ingram,
whose death at San Antonio, Texas,
has been announced, once lived in
this section, his parents having lo-
cated on a farm near here 48 years
ago. Ingram was graduated from
the Cherokee male seminary in the
class of '89, one of his classmates
being "Bill" Arnold, a fullblood
Cherokee, who in after years en-
gaged in bow and arrow making as a
means of livelihood. The members
of the class were John M. Lisenbe
and S. L. Miller, the latter now of
Tulsa. Miller is the only survivor
of the class. Ingram was in the
army during the trouble in the
Philippines and was at one time the
champion rifle shot of the army. A
number of his relatives are buried in
the old Blue Spring cemetery here.

Ingram was one
of the North Carolina
Cherokees, left there
since the Civil War.
