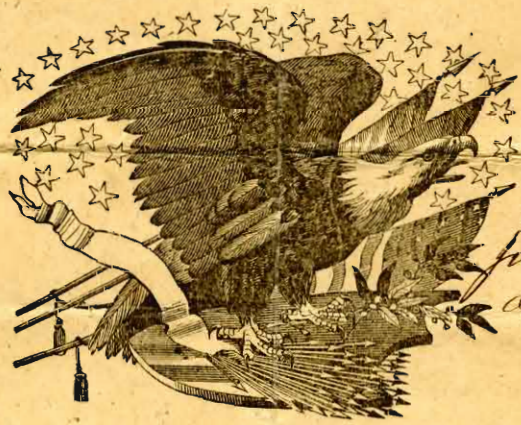

Given in full this 31<sup>st</sup> day of  
June A. D. 1865, at Fort  
Gibson Cherokee Nation  
Daniel M. Adams

Know ye, That Thomas C. Gray a  
Private of Captain White Catcher's  
Company, (A.), 10th Regiment of Indian Home Guards  
VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May  
one thousand eight hundred and 65 to serve three years or  
during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States  
this thirty first (31<sup>st</sup>) day of May, 1865, at Fort Gibson,  
Cherokee Nation by reason of Muster Out per S. O. No. 110, Dept of Arkansas of 1865  
(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)\*

Said Private Thomas C. Gray was born in Cherokee Nation  
in the State of Indian Territory, in twenty years of age,  
5 feet 5 inches high, Dark complexion, Blue eyes,  
Black hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Farmer

Given at Fort Gibson, C. N. this thirty first (31<sup>st</sup>) day of  
May 1865.
