A few moments later, the coffin was borne from the White House and placed in a magnificent funeral car and, under the conduct of a splendid military and civilian escort, conveyed slowly to the Capitol, attended by thousands of men, women and children. On Thursday the Capitol was opened and again, in spite of a steady rain, were repeated the scenes of Tuesday at the White House, thousands slowly mounting the long flight of steps leading to the east entrance and passing through the rotunda.

Funeral Party Leaves.

Precisely at 8 o'clock on the morning of April 21 the train of nine cars pulled out of the station. The funeral train passed through Baltimore, Harrisburg, Philadelphia, New York, Albany, Buffalo, Cleveland, Columbus, Indianapolis, and Chicago to Springfield. Stops were made at all stations and the journey that began on April 21 lasted until

9 o'clock May 3. And so, the funeral of the Great Emancipator that was held 61 years ago is today vivid before the people of the World!
