OSAGE GINA GRAY SELECTED FEATURE ARTIST FOR 7TH ANNUAL TULSA INDIAN ARTS FESTIVAL

Award-winning Osage artist, Gina Gray, has been selected as Featured Artist for the Seventh Annual Tulsa Indian Arts Festival, scheduled February 19-21, 1993, at the Tulsa Trade Center at Expo Square. Heralded as a rising artist who is respected for her unique style of painting, Gray is recognized for her strength in portrait profiles, her vibrant colors, and bold lines.

Gray studied at the Institute of American Indian Arts in Santa Fe, the California Institute of Arts in Valencia, California, and apprenticed in the field of commercial arts where she honed her trademark style. Gray currently maintains a studio and resides in rural Barnsdall, Oklahoma.

Gray's numerous exhibitions include the Gilcrease Museum in Tulsa, Oklahoma; the Heard Museum in Phoenix, Arizona; Red Cloud Indian Art Museum in Pine Ridge, South Dakota; the Institute of American Indian Arts Museum, Santa Fe, New Mexico; Tsa-la-Gi Cherokee Center Museum, Tahlequah, Oklahoma; Daybreak Star Museum, Seattle, Washington; and the Wheelwright Museum, Santa Fe. Her artwork hangs in the private collections of his Royal Highness Prince Tlal bin Mohammed and His Royal Highness Prince Ghazi bin Mohammed of Jordan; Daniel Dapnier, theatre producer, Santa Monica, California; and numerous other prestigious collectors.

Gina is listed in publications including Measure of Excellence Book, 1992; Southwest Art Magazine, May, 1989; Outstanding Young Women of America, 1988; and New Mexico Magazine, August 1990.
