In 1966 the G.D. Searle Pharmaceutical Company of Illinois developed a pigeon contraceptive called Ornitrol as part of a Battle Creek, Michigan study. That contraceptive was never used in Battle Creek's pigeon "control".¹

Instead, Tanglefoot (owner of Tanglefoot Company was then Mayor of Battle Creek, Preston Kool's relative) was used from 1975 to 1983---and Avitrol (a modified version of Ornitrol) has been used since 1983. Both methods are scare tactics which was used to rid the downtown of unwanted pigeons.²

Ornitrol was not used because more federal funds could be tricked out of the Federal Government to rectify the health hazard the pigeons, premeditatedly proven, was set-up to cause: "The nest, states Professor of Biology, Joel Carl Welthy in his book, THE LIFE OF BIRDS of the filthy pigeons become such a culture medium for vermin that in one nest 6,573 individual insects and other invertebrates of 58 species were found in one liter of nest-bottom material".³--i.e, Infant and Maternal mortality and Michigan's latest NAZI scheme---mass injection of pigeon diseases targeted at the cream of the crop of inner city young males.⁴
