Dear Sir/Madam:

Your 11-21-91 show of Now It Can Be Told included the Battle Creek Michigan unsolved murder of Channel 41 Anchorwoman, Diane King.

It is our opinion that her murder was not properly investigated. The reason being that Calhoun County, through the State's entitlement to grants, to combat crime, has gotten out of hand.

Battle Creek, which is the Metropolitan City of Calhoun County, is concentrating on building up statistics of crime which will entitle the area to a larger chunk of the Federal Drug Grants under P.L. 99-570, National & Community Services Act of 1990, P.L.101-610 and of course the current crime bill waiting for President Bush to sign.

Here is an example of the plan Michigan Legislators has for all Minorities.(see P. 3 of Item 1). Since S.B. 8 & 9, there have been other Prisons for Profit Bills introduced. Through these proposed laws and the Michigan Handicappers Law, women on Aid to Dependant Children(ADC), are catergorized as handicapped—along with ex-offenders.

This scheme includes pulling strings to get this area designated a Surplus Labor Area. The Surplus Labor designation entitles the local government to <u>direct</u> Federal Contracts. These contracts are then offered to local Employers which in turn gets a 40% Targeted Jobs Tax Credit(TJTC) if the Employer hires a "Handicapper."
