On March 25, 1994, Gloria Steinem will celebrate her sixtieth birthday. In commemoration of her life and work and the enormous impact she has had on the lives of women all over the world, I have asked President Clinton to present her with the Presidential Medal of Honor. With this award, the entire nation can recognize her achievements and her commitment to human rights.

She is a one woman whirlwind, racing all over the country to encourage women like Carol Mosley Braun and Ada Deer in their elections long before they received national attention. She has hosted countless benefits for every conceivable social and political issue, marched for civil rights, sat in a Native American sweat lodge with a young Native woman who has HIV and just wanted Gloria's presence to help her with the battle ahead. She also writes about personal and poignant moments of her life in the hope that it will help others. Who can forget <u>Ruth's Song</u>, a tribute to her deceased mother who, with all her difficulties, gave us the gift of Gloria, a woman who has influenced Twentieth Century American culture like few other women. And, always and forever she keeps the faith for women's rights everywhere.
