Captain Michael H. Trujillo is a career officer who willingly accepted the request to be reassigned to the IHS Aberdeen Area as Deputy Area Director/Chief Medical Officer in November 1985. In that capacity, he managed the day-to-day affairs of the Aberdeen Area Office and directed the clinical programs of the Area Office and the service units in the four state region. Capt. Trujillo is a dedicated senior medical officer wholly committed to the improvement of the quality of health care for the Indian people and is keenly astute in the finesse of public health management.
