The remedies I seek are:

1. That my grade for summer 1992 in CLIN RADIOGRAPHY 3460 is changed to a "B" grade to reflect my 85 average.
2. That my grade for fall 1992 in ADV CLIN RADIOGRAPHY 4460 is changed to a "B" grade to reflect my 82 average.
3. That I be re-admitted as a senior in good standing in the spring 1994 semester so I can finish by Bachelor of Science Degree in Radiologic Technology.
4. That the File Notes, letters, and memos mentioned in this grievance are no longer a part of my student records in the Department of Radiologic Technology.
5. That I be given the opportunity to challenge Filenotes, memos, or letters written and placed in my folder after September 18, 1992.
6. That the File Notes of General Advisement and Student Conferences Form is amended to include a space for student comments, a student signature line, and it is policy that student's are given adequate time to digest the contents without harassment or undue influence. Furthermore, that a copy is provided for the student to take with them.
7. That the **Clinical Rotation Observation Record** system is revised in such a way that Professor Curcio, Sullivan, the "Committee", or their subordinates do not decide the grade of the student. That the grade comes from an objective source at the clinical site not influenced by Professor Curcio, Sullivan, the "Committee", or any of their subordinates.
8. That this grievance is part of the personnel record and performance evaluation of the following OUHSC employees:
Dr. Lee Holder, Dr. Carole Sullivan, Barbara Curcio,
Barney Esparza, Sharon Sanderson, and Gay Bryant
9. That Dr. Carole Sullivan and Barbara Curcio are no longer in the same budgetary unit where one is supervisor over the other, or where one does a performance evaluation on the other.
10. That Dr. Holder is no longer on the same budgetary unit where he is capable of administratively implementing Dr. Sullivan's
