NEWS ITEM OF J. F. BROWN AND COL. PARKER

We had a call last Saturday from A. D. Irwin, Esq., of Boggy Depot, Choctaw Nation, who reports every thing quiet and prosperous in his section of country and gave us some items of interest.

The travel from the northern and western States towards Texas is immense; and what, with returning movers and the freight trains going to and coming from the N. K. & T. Railway terminus, the stream of vehicles of all descriptions pouring through Boggy Depot is continuous and incessant.

The Chickasaw Council is still in session, but little has been done so far. Governor Brown has resigned and the President of the Senate, Parker, a full-blood Chickasaw has assumed the gubernatorial functions. Col.
