It will be remembered that the Indian Appropriation bill carries Senate amendments on these questions, in which the House will be asked to concur through the Conference Committee.

A prominent member of Congress is just in receipt of the following letter: "If there is war with Spain, get me a commission to organize a company of men, for we want to be in the fight. Excitement is high and every body is talking fight. Every Cherokee Indian will enlist." The letter is from a prominent man, in a prominent town in the Cherokee nation.

The question of additional court legislation for the Indian Territory is in chaos. Nothing can be definitely learned about what will probably be done, and no one can be located on any of the committees here, who expected to press any particular court measure. With the exception of the measure for the establishment of an additional court at Tishomingo, in the Chickasaw
