"We want," he said, "good white men to come in and buy the Indian's land at a fair and reasonable price and become a neighbor of the red men. We want him to buy 120 acres of land, put it in a high state of cultivation and by his example and co-operation teach his Indian neighbor how to farm and improve his adjoining homestead."
