- 49. Be it enacted should any citizen of this nation wish to free his or her negro it shall be lawful for them to do so, provided they take them without the limits of this nation.
- 50. Be it enacted that any citizen of this nation setting his or her dog upon the stock of any other person, upon proof thereof he or she shall pay the damages assesed(sic) by two disinterested persons.
- 51. And be it further enacted that two persons swap horses either of the party proves that he was drunk the bargain shall not be good provided he makes this known within five days.
- 52. Be it enacted that should any person loan a horse mare or mule to another person and should the horse mare or mule die or escape from the hands of the borrower he shall pay the value of such animal said value to be assessed by two disinterested persons.
- 53. Be it enacted that all citizens of this nation shall be liable to work on the public works of the town to which they belong due notice being given and in the event of any person failing to obey such person shall pay a fine of three Dollars.
- 54. Be it enacted that when there is a suit pending before the General Council the parties thereto shall be duly notified thereof at least twenty days before its session. Should one party fail to attend, the party being present shall be heard and desission(sic) made which shall be final unless the party being absent shall within twenty days after adjournment of said council come before one of the Principal Chiefs and give good
