of the Creek Nation the amount expended and for what specified object expended.

- 96. Be it further enacted That it shall be the duty of the Board of Trustees of each school to superintend the building of School Houses in their provinces as are herein provided for, but the superintendents alone shall have power of appointing and removing Teachers determining their competency the kind and number of Books required, the branches to be taught, the time to be employed in teaching, the number and length of vacations in each year and select the place of location, but in no case he employs as teachers one holder of abolition principles. Nevertheless it be the duty of the Trustees to visit the school under their care at least every three months.
- 97. Be it further enacted That the two Superintendents shall be allowed for their services each the sum of three hundred Dollars anually(sic) from the school funds.
- 98. Be it further enacted That the Superintendents shall not allow any Teacher more than Three hundred and fifty Dol-lars per annum for Teaching.
- 99. Be it enacted That the Superintendants before entering upon the duties of his office he shall give bond with good Security to the amount of five Thousand Dollars for the faithful performance of his duties, which bond shall be executed in favor of the Creek Nation.
- 100. Be it enacted That in all cases where natives are competent to Teach they shall have the preference.
