

108. Be it enacted That D. N. McIntosh and James Smith be and are hereby appointed Superintendents of Shops whose duty it shall be to regulate and asuperintend all matters pertaining to shops.

109. Be it enacted That it shall be the duty of the several smiths to shoe the horses of the Light horse Companies of the Creek Nation but none others shall be shod without an order from the Superintendants of Shops.

110. Be it enacted by the General Council held May the 8th 1859 that all free born persons excepting those of negro origin heretofore received and acknowledged by us as citizens of the Creek Nation are hereby declaired(sic) bonafied(sic) members and citizens.

111. Be it further enacted that the children of Creek woman by negro men when they are not of more than half negro shall be considered bonafied(sic) members of the Creek nation.

112. Be it resolved That it shall after the passage of this act be the imperative duty of slave holders to keep their slaves immediately around their improvements.

113. Resolved, that no slave shall without a writen(sic) pass be found over two miles from the premises of his or her owners.

114. Any slave who shall be found guilty of the violation of the above law shall receive twenty-five lashes, for every such offence.
